Education		<p><b>Teacher Quality Partnership Grants - \$100 million</b> to consortia of colleges, school districts and states to improve the quality of the teaching workforce. Improve the quality of new and prospective teachers by improving the preparation of prospective teachers and enhancing professional development activities for new teachers; hold teacher preparation programs at institutions of higher education (IHEs) accountable for preparing highly qualified teachers; and recruit highly qualified individuals, including minorities and individuals from other occupations, into the teaching force..Administered through US Dept of Education. 35 awards nationwide.</p> <p><b>Notice of intent to file June 26, 2009.</b></p> <p><b>Deadline to apply July 23, 2009.</b></p>

Eligible projects include highway and bridge projects, public transportation projects, passenger and freight rail projects, and port infrastructure investments. <b>Deadline to apply September 15, 2009</b>

Water/ Clean- up		<p><b>Rural Water and Waste Disposal</b> - \$1.3 billion for loans and grants to regional, local, non-profit, and tribal organizations for the development of water and waste disposal systems in rural areas and towns with a population below 10,000. Through USDA.</p> <p><b>Petroleum Technologies Reduction Grants</b> - \$210 million to school districts, local and tribal govts, and non-profits thru DOE to create programs which reduce emissions and clean air.</p> <p><b>Deadline to apply September 29, 2009.</b></p>

Housing and Community Development	<p><b>CDBG Block Grants</b> - \$5.7 million to NM Department of Finance and Administration /Local Governments Division for a variety of community development, economic development, and affordable housing purposes. \$4 million already allocated.</p>	<p><b>Green Retrofit for Multi-family Housing-</b> \$1 billion to owners of affordable housing (section 8) for grants and loans to make energy and green retrofits. Improvements must address: elderly or disabled, public housing transformation or gap financing for projects that are stalled due to financing issues. <b>Deadline to apply August 18.</b></p> <p><b>Neighborhood Stabilization Program</b> - \$1.93 billion to states and local governments, and non-profits to redevelop abandoned and foreclosed homes in areas of greatest need. Administered by HUD. <b>Deadline to apply July 17, 2009.</b></p>

Housing and Community Development		<p><b>Rural Community Facilities Program</b> - \$130 million loans and grants to regional, state, local, and tribal organizations for the construction or maintenance of rural community facilities, including hospitals, health clinics, and child and elder care facilities. Administered through USDA.</p> <p><b>Economic Development Administration Assistance Grants</b> - \$100 million to local, tribal and state governments, non-profits and universities for planning, technical and infrastructure assistance for communities who have severe job loss as a result of corporate restructuring. Accepting applications through February 2010.</p>

Energy	<p><b>Weatherization Assistance Program</b> - \$28.9 million for energy efficiency measures for low-income homeowners or renters. Administered by the NM Mortgage Finance Authority. <a href="http://www.housingnm.org/weatherization">http://www.housingnm.org/weatherization</a>.</p>	<p><b>Energy Efficient Information and Communication Grants</b> – \$50 million to develop new technologies to address the challenge of controlling the power usage of microprocessors or servers and supporting power and cooling systems. Open to for profit entities. Estimated 15 grants will be awarded. <b>Deadline to apply is July 21, 2009.</b></p> <p><b>Geothermal Technologies Grants</b> - \$170 million to demonstrate new exploration technologies, evaluate production from oil and gas wells and collect and develop data. Open to all entities. Estimated 60 awards nationwide. <b>Deadline to apply is July 22, 2009.</b></p>

More Energy		<p><b>Wind Consortia</b>– \$24 million to Universities partnering with wind energy industry to advance research in materials design, performance measures, analytical models, repair operations, or component manufacturing. 2 grants nationwide will be awarded. <b>Deadline to apply is July 29, 2009.</b></p> <p><b>High Penetration Solar Deployment</b>– Department of Energy will award grants to 1) develop modeling tools with high penetration scenarios of PV on a distribution system, 2) develop monitoring, control and integration systems to enable cost-effective widespread deployment of small modular PV systems and 3) demonstrate the integration of PV and energy storage into Smart Grid applications. Open to anyone. <b>Deadline to apply is July 30, 2009.</b></p>

Broadband		<p><b>Rural Broadband Initiative</b> - \$7.2 billion for loans, grants, and grant guarantees for broadband infrastructure in rural, unserved, and underserved areas of the country without sufficient access to high speed broadband service. Administered through the Department of Commerce/National Telecommunications and Information Administration and USDA/Rural Development Administration. <b>Deadline to apply August 14, 2009.</b></p>

Workforce	<p><b>Employment Training Services for Adults, Youth and Dislocated Workers</b> - \$15.8 million to NM Department of Workforce Solutions for training, education and job search assistance for adults and youth who have been laid-off or need to enter the workforce. Dollars are distributed to regional workforce boards.</p>	<p><b>Green Jobs</b> – Grants to train workers in energy efficiency and renewable energy. <b>Deadline to apply September 4, 2009.</b></p> <p><b>Pathways Out of Poverty.</b> Training and support services for targeted populations to find economic self sufficiency through employment in the energy efficiency and renewable energy industries. <b>Deadline for applications is September 29, 2009.</b></p> <p><b>Sector Partnership Grants</b> - \$400 million for partnerships between industry, government and colleges to strengthen and revitalize industries.</p>
